

SCHEDULE H

CRITERIA FOR EVALUATING PROGRAM OF STUDY

1. The following criteria apply to assess whether a master's program of study has content that is primarily psychological in nature :
 - (a) the training in psychology is master's training offered in a recognized degree-granting institution in Canada, or a recognized university in a foreign country;
 - (b) the program is publicly identified as a psychology program standing as a recognizable, coherent, organizational entity and providing an integrated, organized sequence of study and training;
 - (c) the majority of the faculty members in the program are psychologists registered or licensed to practice the profession of psychology;
 - (d) the program has a body of resident students enrolled for a master's degree;
 - (e) the program requires completion of a four year undergraduate degree in psychology or substantially equivalent study;
 - (f) the program requires the completion of a minimum of one academic year of full-time resident graduate study or equivalent part-time study;
 - (g) the program curriculum includes successful completion of academic course content areas satisfactory to the registration committee's policies, including supervised practicum, internship, field or laboratory training appropriate to the practice or teaching of, or research in, psychology.

2. The following criteria apply to assess whether a doctoral program of study has content that is primarily psychological in nature:
 - (a) the training in psychology is offered in a recognized degree-granting institution in Canada, or a recognized university in a foreign country;
 - (b) the program is publicly identified as a psychology program standing as a recognizable, coherent, organizational entity and providing an integrated, organized sequence of study and training;
 - (c) the majority of the faculty members in the program are psychologists registered or licensed to practice the profession of psychology;
 - (d) the program has a body of resident students enrolled for a doctoral degree;

- (e) the program requires completion of a four year undergraduate degree in psychology or substantially equivalent study;
- (f) the program requires the completion of a minimum of three academic years of full-time resident graduate study or equivalent part-time study with at least one of the three years of resident graduate study at the educational institution granting the doctoral degree during enrolment in the doctoral program;
- (g) the program curriculum includes successful completion of academic course content areas satisfactory to the registration committee's policies, including supervised practicum, internship, field or laboratory training appropriate to the practice or teaching of, or research in, psychology.

3. If the master's or doctoral degree of an applicant is from an institution outside Canada or the United States, the applicant must arrange to have it evaluated by an entity acceptable to the registration committee to determine if the academic credentials of that degree are comparable in level to a degree from a Canadian university. While the evaluation will indicate to the College whether the academic credentials are comparable in level to either a master's or doctoral degree granted by a Canadian university, the registration committee will assess whether the content of the degree is primarily psychological in nature in accordance with the applicable criteria set out in section 1 or 2 of this Schedule.
